

#### Step Nine. "what an order, I can't go through with it"

Why? Because it takes a lot of courage to seek out those we have harmed, to be vulnerable, and to have no expectations of how the person we are making our amends to will react. To put myself in a position to be lambasted. And not to react in a defensive manner, accusing them of harming me as well, or resorting to a bunch of excuses.

And "courage" was something I had relied on alcohol to supply for years in stressful situations. Beginning in high school, asking the girls to dance, putting on the cool guy act with the other boys so as not to get picked on or bullied. Alcohol allowed me a false persona, fueled by "liquid courage"

Fortunately as a newcomer the old-timers, and my first sponsor told me to work the Steps in order, not to worry about Step Nine. I wasn't anywhere near ready for that. Of course I wanted to jump ahead and collect all those awesome sounding Promises. But my fear and lack of "liquid courage" kept me from being ready to take the required pain to be "painstaking"

Working Steps One to Eight gave me the time I needed for that. Many months of meetings, gaining trust and faith in Steps Two and Three. Getting honest and clarity working Four and Five. Gaining Willingness and a deeper belief that God as I understand God could help me to be less baffled and more reliant on God. Spotting how much God was doing for me what I could not do for myself. And listening to others in meetings share their experiences, and strength making their amends, which gave me Hope.

When the time was right I made my amends with my chief resentment, my father first, my mother and then my two brothers.

My sponsor guided me to write a letter to my first love, who broke my teenage heart, and to let go of the pain I had lugged around for decades wallowing in self pity. It took four rewrites before my sponsor said I had finally cleansed the letter of ego and resentment lol!

At my Fifty Year high school reunion I met up with two brothers who were my close friends at school. We were having a good time talking about where their lives had taken them. Neither were drinkers, even back then. I could have just left it at laughing about the old times. But suddenly I knew my Higher Power was ready to act, and I told them I needed to make my amends to both of them. Letting them know that their friendship had been very important to me, but that my alcoholism took over my life. I sacrificed their bond of love and respect for the life of a drunk.

After listening intently they told me how grateful they were I had found sobriety. But then they went a step further. At our Ten Year reunion I of course got smashed and passed out while talking to them. They told me how hopeless they felt, not knowing what they could do. So for many years they carried a guilt, a sense of shame that they had to abandon their friendship with me. They just couldn't witness my self destruction. They accepted my amends to them, and then made their amends to me! I sure didn't see that one coming.

We all left that night feeling a new freedom and a new happiness. No longer did any of us need to regret the past. The power of Step Nine is indeed worth overcoming the fear of the pain, in order to become painstaking.

When your Higher Power gives you the opportunity, and the courage to make any amends to anyone, take it. Why? Because those appealing Promises only can materialize if and when you're halfway through, and take the actions of Step Nine
