At the ago of 13 I had my first drink. Initially it was to fit in with my older cousin and his friends. I wanted to be accepted by his friends. I gave up my free will and the ability to think for myself.

There was nothing I wouldn't do for this beast we call alcohol. It made me believe that I was the most important person in the world. I was invincible. Nothing could touch me, nothing dare touch me. That was my false belief. That was the extent to which alcohol had consumed me. I lived that life of addiction for 37 years and it me back with a long list of chaos, destruction, countless victims and lifetime in prison

- September 1943, Tuscon's Arizona Star reports on an AA group with eight men and three women.
- September 9, 1945, San Diego holds its first women's meeting!
- September 1946, the first AA Group in Mexico City was formed.
- September 17, 1954, Bill D., the man in the bed, dies in Akron, Ohio.

# <u>Step Nine</u> - "Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others."


"Such people" are the people we listed in our eighth step. So in Step Nine, we actually begin to make those amends to people we have harmed. This is a character building step for me for sure!! To humble myself, go to a person face-to-face, admit my mistake, apologize and then ask what I can do to make the situation right. All the while keeping in mind only my wrongdoing. "Under no condition do we criticize such a person or argue. Simply we tell him that we will never get over drinking until we have done our utmost to straighten out the past. We are there to sweep off our side of the street, realizing that nothing worth while can be accomplished until we do so, never trying to tell him what he should do. His faults are not discussed. We stick to our own. If our manner is calm, frank, and open, we will be gratified with the result." (Pp 77, 78 Alcoholics Anonymous).

The Twelve and Twelves says that "Good timing is important in making amends." For instance, financial amends may have to be put on hold until we get a job. We go to the people we owe amends to, tell them what AA is, and what we are trying to do. We can pay, or promise to pay, whatever obligations, financial or otherwise, we owe. But above all, we should try to be absolutely sure that we are not delaying because we are afraid. "...to take responsibility for the wellbeing of others at the same time, is the very spirit of Step Nine. (Twelve and Twelve).

Having made direct, face-to-face amends to family members, friends, and coworkers, often times they don't have an opinion one way or the other, but in the end say "well, good luck and thanks! So happy you're doing something about your drinking!" That was surprising to me. Other people thought I should stop drinking. Huh... Other times they have said "Oh, I'm sorry too" and a whole new discussion begins. As a result of working the steps, I comprehend the word serenity and I know peace. Fear of people has left me. Which is a good thing because they seem to be everywhere. Extravagant promises? No, and they will always materialize if we work for them.

Was I looking for peace, serenity, happiness when I stumbled into AA? No, not really. I don't know anyone who said I want to be happy so I'm going to AA. But that is what I have found here along with so much more. I hope you do too.
